Grade Levels: 10-12 Units of Credit: **1.0**

Test and Quizzes : Quizzes are on a regular basis. Pop quizzes are given without warning at any time on the material covered in class or any reading assignment. You will be tested at the end of every unit.

Formative Assessments include, but are not limited to homework, class work, some labs, quizzes, rough drafts, and sections of projects/research papers/presentations.

Summative Assessments include, but are not limited to unit tests, final projects, final essays, final research papers, and final presentations, and culminating labs.

Work Habits and participation will also be evaluated after every unit based on the categories of Responsibility, Participation, Assignment Completion, & Interpersonal Skills.

Makeup Work: Missing and make-up work are <u>your responsibility</u> to pick up. **ALL missing** and make-up work is due by the unit test for full credit. ALL missing tests and quizzes must be made-up within one week of the original date given. However, be advised that that due to the laboratory intensive nature of the course, some assignments simply cannot be made up; alternative assignments will be required if they are missed.

Cheating: If caught cheating/plagiarizing it will be assumed that all the points you have earned on that assignment are in doubt and thus your points will result in a zero.

Fieldtrips: To attend any field trip offered by the school, you must be in good academic standing (74 or higher in core classes), no excessive absences and no major disciplinary referrals.
